

Their purchases would then be delivered to them at home, with no need to carry heavy bags.
- 2. Enhancing the User Experience: Some savvy museums and art galleries have been quick to realize the potential in QR codes for enhancing user experiences. Art galleries such as The Cleveland Museum of Art place QR codes next to exhibits to direct visitors to online or audio tours, or to provide more in-depth information.

The charging system is based on "piezoelectric film", a technology commonly used in hi-fi speakers, which turns vibrations into electrical voltage, and is thin enough to be woven into a cotton shirt. The energy gathered from sound waves is stored in a reservoir battery, which can then be plugged into a mobile phone to charge it.
